The key barriers to learning that have been identified are</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Language acquisition</li><li>Seriously challenging family circumstances</li><li>Limited life experiences and access to a variety of opportunities</li><li>Limited access to reading opportunities at home</li></ul>

### **Objectives of Spending PPG 2016-17**

Increase the % of disadvantaged pupils achieving EXS in reading at KS2

Increase the % of disadvantaged pupils making expected progress in reading at KS2

Increase the % of disadvantaged pupils achieving a GLD at the end of Reception

Increase the % of disadvantaged pupils achieving a Higher Standard in reading, Writing and Maths at the end of KS2

### **Summary of Spending PPG 2016-17**

Additional teaching staff deployed to teach smaller groups of disadvantaged pupils not on track in reading in KS2.

Resources purchased to promote reading throughout the school and support with high level of comprehension challenge.

Skilled TAs appointed to deliver targeted 1:1 support for disadvantaged children not on track in reading.

CPD for staff to support with the delivery of the new curriculum and particularly accelerating the progress of disadvantaged children struggling to reach targets of a curriculum designed to be taught over 6 years but delivered in 3 .

ECAR teacher supporting KS2 disadvantaged children in reading.

CARITAS family worker employed to ensure that disadvantaged families receive excellent support in order to remove barriers to learning.

Appointment of speech and language therapist to support disadvantaged pupils with speech and language difficulties thus enabling progress in all core subjects.

Other spending includes: Home tuition, additional Ipads for pupils, subsidised breakfast club, after school club, sports clubs and residential trips.

### **Monitoring of the Impact of Spending PPG 2016-17**

The impact of pupil premium spending is monitored and tracked constantly through teacher assessment and the school's assessment and tracking systems. Progress and attainment data is gathered half termly and analysed in order to identify progress towards targets. Progress of each pupil is scrutinised half termly and teaching and interventions are reviewed accordingly.
