Summary of Expenditure of PPG 2016/17

- A maths graduate is appointed and continues to work with disadvantaged pupils in order to accelerate progress in maths, including that of higher attainers.
- Additional teachers are employed to accelerate the progress of pupils in receipt of the pupil premium grant and to lead regular small group and 1:1 intervention sessions to aid the progress of pupils who have been identified as requiring accelerated progress.
- Reading Recovery and Guided Reading sessions are delivered by trained teachers and teaching assistants to accelerate the reading progress of eligible pupils.
- Specific staff training linked to school development priorities is provided to ensure the best quality teaching and learning is provided for all.
- Outreach support from specialist schools is purchased by the school to support with eligible pupils and pupils with additional needs.
- Electronic reading devices have been purchased including suitable reading materials which are available on a loan basis to encourage reading progress for eligible pupils.
- Additional tablets are now available to further enhance learning of eligible pupils.
- After school clubs are delivered to promote well being, positive attitudes and a variety of diverse activities including karate, multisports, dance and football. Eligible pupils are prioritized.
- A Speech and Language therapist from “The Speech Bubble” has been deployed by the school one day per week to work with eligible pupils with speech and language difficulties.
- Early morning and after school reading clubs, writing and maths booster groups are delivered by trained members of staff to eligible pupils.
- Pupils are enrolled on a ‘Food and Farming Course’ to increase pupils knowledge and understanding of the world.
