

### **SPORT PREMIUM:**

#### Sacred Heart RC Primary School PE and Sport Strategy 2018 - 19

#### What is the Primary School PE & Sport Premium?

Since 2013 14 the government has allocated extra funding to all primary schools to improve Physical Education (PE) and Sport so that they develop pupils' healthy lifestyles. This will be continued in the 2018 19 financial year.

#### What should it be used for?

Schools may choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons
  - provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers
  - improvement sport culture and opportunities for lunchtime by developing lunchtime activities
    - support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs
    - run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the 'School Games'
      - run sports activities with other schools

## How much have will we receive for 2018- 19?

In 2018 19 we will receive approximately £18000 (based on last year's figure) to be spent specifically on Sports Premium.
