PE And SPORT PREMIUM: Impact Report 2018/19

What is the Primary School PE & Sport Premium?

Since 2013-14 the government has allocated extra funding to all primary schools to improve Physical Education (PE) and Sport so that they develop pupils' healthy lifestyles.

What should it be used for?

Schools may choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons
 - provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers
- improvement sport culture and opportunities for lunchtime by developing lunchtime activities
 - support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs
 - run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the 'School Games'
 - run sports activities with other schools

How much have did we receive for 2018-2019?

In 2018 19 we received £18000 to be spent specifically on Sports Premium.

Increase participation in competitive sport	<p>School was awarded the “Schools Games Mark”. This is a government-led scheme which rewards schools for their commitment to the development of competition across the school and into the community</p> <p>There was 100% attendance for all after school clubs which offered a variety of different, competitive sports across all key stages.</p> <p>School won the East Manchester Primary Football League</p> <p>School participated throughout the whole school year in inter-school competitions for: Football, Rugby, Tennis, Golf, Cricket, Dance, Athletics, Rounders, Hockey, Basketball</p>	£3000
