Language acquisition

Seriously challenging family circumstances

Limited life experiences and access to a variety of opportunities

Limited access to reading opportunities at home

Summary of Spending PPG 2018 - 2019

Additional teaching staff deployed to teach smaller groups of disadvantaged pupils not on track to achieve the expected standard.

Trained and appointed a Reading Recovery teacher to deliver high quality intervention to disadvantaged pupils.

Appointment of maths specialist to support with the teaching of higher attaining disadvantaged pupils to ensure good progress.

Resources purchased to promote reading throughout the school and support with high level of comprehension challenge.

CPD for staff focusing on skills to accelerate the progress of disadvantaged children.

CARITAS family worker employed to ensure that disadvantaged families receive excellent support in order to remove barriers to learning.

Appointment of speech and language therapist to support disadvantaged pupils with speech and language difficulties thus enabling progress in all core subjects.

Appointment of Educational Psychologist to support disadvantaged pupils with learning and behavioural difficulties thus enabling access to broad and balanced curriculum; zero exclusions of disadvantaged pupils and attendance in line with non-disadvantaged

Other spending includes: additional lpads for pupils, subsidised breakfast club, after school booster clubs, subsidised music lessons and residential trips.
