#### **Summary of Main Barriers to Educational Achievement of Eligible Pupils**

The Senior Leadership Team continually looks at ways to improve the life chances of our children and the barriers to their learning and development. The key barriers to learning that have been identified are

Language acquisition

Seriously challenging family circumstances

Limited life experiences and access to a variety of opportunities

Limited access to reading opportunities at home

#### **Objectives of Spending PPG 2019-20**

Increase the % of disadvantaged pupils achieving the higher level standard in reading, writing and maths combined at the end of KS2.

Disadvantaged pupils continue to achieve in line and above with the national attainment figures in reading, writing and maths at the end of KS1 and 2.

Disadvantaged pupils quickly learn to apply basic skills across the curriculum.

Disadvantaged pupils read fluently across the curriculum.

Pupils receive specialist music tuition and musical talent is developed and stretched.

Pupils receive specialist art tuition and artistic talent is developed and stretched.

Barriers to learning are removed through therapy sessions, attendance support and early help.

Pupils' speech and language progress is accelerated.

There are increased opportunities of extracurricular activities for disadvantaged pupils.

### **Summary of Spending PPG 2019-20**

Additional teaching staff deployed to teach smaller groups of disadvantaged pupils not on track to achieve the expected standard.

Maths specialist employed to support with the teaching of higher attaining disadvantaged pupils to ensure good progress.

Reading Recovery Teacher employed to deliver interventions to accelerate progress of disadvantaged pupils in reading.

Purchase a wide range of reading material linked directly to the curriculum in order to promote reading throughout the school and support with reading opportunities across the curriculum.

Employ specialist teachers in art and music

Deliver a range of parent workshops including reading and phonics and an 8 week programme for parents to support them with helping children develop literacy and numeracy skills. Families Connect

Employ CARITAS social worker to support disadvantaged pupils and families socially and emotionally, removing barriers to learning and increasing attendance.

Continue to fund speech and language therapist to support disadvantaged pupils with speech and language difficulties thus enabling progress in all core subjects.

TAs deliver a wider range of extra curricular activities.

Other spending to support the above includes: additional Ipads for pupils, subsidised breakfast club and after school intervention clubs, subsidised residential trips.

### **Monitoring of the Impact of Spending PPG 2019-20**

The impact of pupil premium spending is monitored and tracked constantly through teacher assessment and the school's monitoring and evaluation systems. Progress and attainment data is gathered half termly and analysed by senior leaders in order to identify progress towards targets. Progress of each pupil is scrutinised half termly and teaching and interventions are reviewed accordingly. Attendance of pupils is monitored daily and analysed termly.
