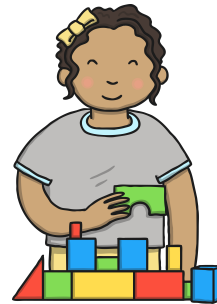

Maths Focus - We will be revisiting prior learning in a number of areas. We will be sorting objects by 'long' and 'short' along with practising our number recognition and exploring money when learning about the hairdresser.
