## Class 2 (Year 1 and Year 2) – Orange Bubble

### New Health and Safety Routines

Children will be supervised whilst washing their hands on entering the school building, and before and after eating. The children will use hand sanitiser on entering or exiting a room, and after coughing or sneezing.

There is a plentiful supply of tissues in the classroom for the children to use when necessary.

This year, the children have been supplied with their own pencil case with all the necessary resources they will need.

The start of the school day for Class 2 is at 9.00am. Children should line up in the playground once it is time for the Orange Bubble to enter the school grounds.

Please ensure you collect your child each day at 3.20pm promptly from outside Class 2 door. We call each child’s name individually to ensure they go home with the correct adult. We try to do this as quickly as we can but it can take some time, particularly at the start of the year when we are getting to know parents. We ask that you are patient with us whilst we do this as our priority is the children’s safety.

If your child is going to be collected by somebody different than usual, you must inform the school office or a member of staff from Class 2 in advance.

### Homework

Please listen to your child read at home as often as possible and make a note of it in their reading record. Reading books will be changed each Thursday. New reading books cannot be given out if any books are overdue.

Children in Year 2 will begin to use the Accelerated Reading Scheme once they reach reading level 25. Once your child begins this, they will complete quizzes in school so they will need their reading books in school on Thursdays and Fridays in order to do this.

For the time being, no other homework will be set. Once we are ready to start setting it, homework will be given out every Friday.

Spellings will be sent home each Friday from your child's phonic teacher. Spelling tests will take place on Friday mornings. Any spelling practice work does not need to be returned school. You will be informed of your child's spelling results each week.

### Things to Remember

- Wear P.E. kits to school each Tuesday. No change of clothes is required.
- Water bottles are provided by school and will be kept at school.
- Only bring book bags into school on **Thursday** and **Friday**.
- Please only bring the necessary items to school on the correct days to limit the number of items being passed from home to school.

### Rewards and Sanctions

To ensure a safe and positive learning environment all staff and pupils follow the 'traffic light system' promoting a consistent code of conduct.

- Green for go - all the children start here.
- Amber - children move down to amber and a verbal warning poor behaviour if the initial verbal warning has no effect; this warning alerts children to think about their behaviour.
- Red – If children continue to misbehave, they move further down to red and receive detention.
- Gold - a child moves up to gold for outstanding behaviour or for outstanding work.

Good behaviour is praised and rewarded with Dojo points which can be saved up and exchanged for a prize from the prize box
