Critical Workers and Vulnerable Children

After half term, we will require evidence from key worker employers, for both parents if they are living in the same household to state that they are required to work on site during this current lockdown. We expect that children will remain at home if there is another responsible adult in the household who is not a critical worker.

Priority will be given to vulnerable children, health and social care workers, public safety and emergency service workers and teaching and educational support staff. If there are any available places after we have allocated to the above, we will allocate to other critical workers.

We will allocate places for the first two weeks of term from 22nd February to 5th March.

Applications should be returned to school by 5pm on 10th February. Application forms can be found on the school website under Coronavirus Information.

We will inform all parents immediately when the government confirms the return date for all children.
