The Baptism of the Lord




Last Sunday, we celebrated the final feast of the Christmas season: the Baptism of the Lord. "After Jesus was baptised, he came from the water and behold, the heavens were opened [for him], and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove [and] coming upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, saying, 'This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased" (Mt 3:16-17).

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks the moment when Jesus was baptised by John the Baptist. Although Jesus, born without sin, did not require baptism, he chose to be baptised to set an example for us and to reveal his true identity as God's Son, the living presence of God on earth. When we renew our baptismal promises, we affirm our faith in the transformative power of baptism and our commitment to a life in Christ.

For young children, the transition from the birth of Christ (at the end of December) to his baptism as an adult (in January) can be puzzling. Reflecting on their own baptisms can help bridge the gap and refocus on Ordinary Time. Consider sharing stories about their baptism day: who was there, how their godparents were chosen, and the celebration that followed. Most importantly, remind your children that, just as the Spirit descended upon Jesus, his presence remains with us always, offering guidance and love through both joyful and challenging times.


